# RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE AVON TOWNSHIP COMPLETE STREETS POLICY AVON TOWNSHIP, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, AVON TOWNSHIP is a public body organized and operating under the authority of the constitution and laws of the State of Illinois:

WHEREAS, transportation, quality of life, and economic development are all connected through well-planned, well designed, and context sensitive transportation solutions: and

WHEREAS, a complete street is defined as one that provides safe and convenient access for all users of the road, including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, and vehicular traffic; and

WHEREAS, AVON TOWNSHIP views all transportation improvements as opportunities to connect neighborhoods, calm traffic and improve safety, provide greater access and mobility for users of the public way. and recognizes bicycle, pedestrian, and transit modes as integral elements of the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, AVON TOWNSHIP's comprehensive plan promotes a transportation principal that residents should be able to drive, walk, or bike safely and conveniently throughout the township for daily needs and activities; and

WHEREAS, AVON TOWNSHIP desires to adopt an AVON TOWNSHIP Complete Streets Policy, pursuant to which decisions regarding the public right-of-way will promote the creation of Complete Streets; and

WHEREAS, AVON TOWNSHIP has determined that approving and adopting this policy will serve and be in the best interest of the residents;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it Resolved by the Supervisor and Board of Trustees of AVON TOWNSHIP of Lake County, Illinois that:

**SECTION 1** The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part of this Resolution.

**SECTION 2** APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF POLICY. The Board OF TRUSTEES OF AVON hereby approves and adopts the Policy in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A.

**SECTION 3** If any section, paragraph, clause, or provisions of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Resolution.

**SECTION 4** All Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 5** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

#### COMPLETE STREETS POLICY

#### I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>.

The Avon Township is committed to creating a safe, accessible, and sustainable transportation network for all users, including pedestrians, cyclists, motorists, and transit riders. This Complete Streets Policy aims to incorporate multi-modal transportation strategies into the planning, design, and maintenance of our roadways and public spaces.

#### II. VISION STATEMENT.

Avon Township envisions a transportation system that prioritizes safety, accessibility, and environmental stewardship, ensuring that all residents can travel throughout the township without barriers.

#### III. POLICY GOALS.
